- (1) Prove that $(A \supset B) = (\neg A \vee B)$.
- (2) Show that, if a lattice is distributive then both the laws

$$x \wedge (y \vee z) = (x \wedge y) \vee (x \wedge z)$$

$$x \vee (y \wedge z) = (x \vee y) \wedge (x \vee z)$$

hold.

- (3) Show an example of non-distributive lattice. Prove that the distributive law fails on it.
